There is a certain set of standard hymns, a "core" repertoire, that every Catholic congregation should know. These are hymns that should be familiar and comfortable, hymns that are sung often, hymns that are taught to our children. They represent the "comfort food" of hymnody. Occasionally new hymns should be taught and added to the congregation's repertoire—hymns that can add "spice" to a certain celebration or season, pinpointing a specific theme or mood. Let's take as our starting point a list of 150 hymns compiled by the Consultation on Ecumenical Hymnody, the titles of which can be found at www.canticanova.com/articles/hymns/art241.htm. The codes after each title represent which major Catholic hymnals contain that title. Many of these should be well known by the congregation. At the end of the ecumenical list is an additional group of hymns that every Catholic congregation should know.
